Citizens' Assembly Workshop: Developing principles for reconfiguration as a guide for STPs and CCGs

The aim of this workshop is to develop a one page guidance for Sustainability and Transformation Partnerships (STPs) and Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs) covering the key points from the patient and public perspective that need to be taken into account within STP and CCG proposals for large scale service change.

This will include a checklist of what STPs and CCGs should address in their clinical review documentation (pre-consultation business case (PCBC)) detailing proposed models of care in order to ensure their plans are patient centric.

CA members who are inputting to formal reviews will be able to use this checklist to guide their review of the documentation provided and input to panel discussion.
