South West Clinical Senate





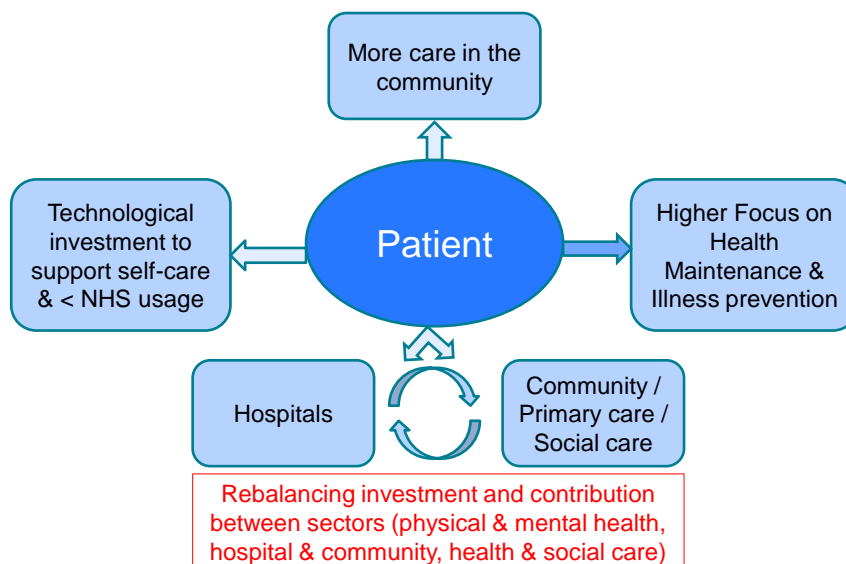
Senate advice to date

- Also – mental health /public health / UECNs recommendations follow up

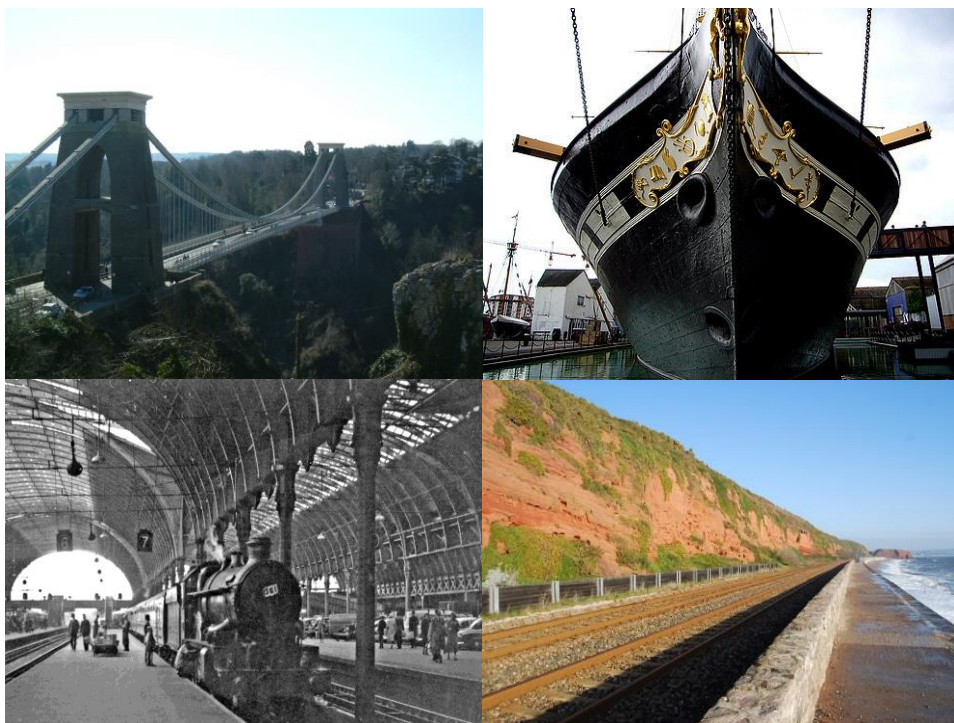
