

Each greenhouse gas's (GHG) global warming potential (GWP) is measured against CO₂ as a reference gas

The Climate Change Act (2008) was introduced to ensure the UK cuts its carbon dioxide equivalent emissions by 80% by 2050 against a 1990 baseline

The interim targets for reductions in carbon dioxide equivalent emissions to meet the Climate Change Act are

- a 34% reduction by 2020
- a 50% reduction by 2025





In 2008 the NHS contributed around 3% of England's total carbon dioxide emissions the equivalent of 18m tonnes of C02 per year, making it the largest public sector contributor to climate change.



The NHS, public health and social care system has set an ambitious goal to reduce carbon dioxide equivalent emissions across building energy use, travel and procurement of goods and services by 34% by 2020.



"The climate emergency is a health emergency," Stevens said. "We, the NHS, as the single biggest organisation across this country are both part of the solution and part of the problem. We are 40% of public sector emissions, and although we have reduced our carbon footprint by around a fifth over the past decade, we've got to make major changes if we're going to help this country become carbon net neutral."


